

Directions to the Grades 3-6 Student Survey

On your whiteboard, copy the following example.

I like to play video games.	5 Strongly Agree	4 Agree	3 Neither	2 Disagree	1 Strongly Disagree
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Now, read this script: “Our school wants to understand your thoughts about your teacher and your classroom. You will take a survey with 12 sentences. I will read each sentence aloud, and you will decide how much you agree or disagree with it.

“You will see the numbers 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 next to some words:

- 5 means ‘Strongly Agree.’
- 4 means ‘Agree.’
- 3 means ‘Neither.’
- 2 means ‘Disagree.’
- 1 means ‘Strongly Disagree.’

“Circle the number and the words that tell how you think about the sentence.

“Let’s do an example together. Look at the whiteboard as I read.”

I like to play video games.	5 Strongly Agree	4 Agree	3 Neither	2 Disagree	1 Strongly Disagree
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Read: “I like to play video games.

“Think about how much you agree with that sentence.

- If you really like to play video games, circle 5 for ‘Strongly Agree.’

- If you like to play but not a lot, circle 4 for ‘Agree.’
- If you don’t play video games or don’t care either way, circle 3 for ‘Neither.’
- If you don’t like to play, circle 2 for ‘Disagree.’
- If you really don’t like video games, circle 1 for ‘Strongly Disagree.’”

Read these instructions before starting:

“Before you begin, please fill in the top of your page. Fill in the date, your name, the name of your teacher, the subject your teacher teaches, and the grade you are in. We will fill out the rest.

“I will read each sentence to you. Then, you will think about the sentence and circle the words and number you feel is right for you.”

“Ready? Let’s begin.”

Go around to each student to ensure they know how to complete the survey. Help those who need help understanding a question.
