The Psychology Department has a long-standing tradition of innovative research that has a powerful impact in the real world. We offer experiences to graduate students through more than 30 active research programs. Clinical experiences are provided in partnership with more than ten USU and community organizations, plus numerous school districts.

Psychology students actively collaborate with faculty on a variety of research projects, including parenting services for Latinx families, interventions for individuals with anxiety disorders, cognition in young children, and animal modeling of drug abuse and impulsivity. Students are active in presenting at national conferences, authoring journal articles and book chapters, and submitting grants for funding.
