Over the past weeks, citizens of Iran have taken to the streets in protest to question the unjust killing of Mahsa Amini while in custody by the so-called morality police. Mahsa, or Jina, was a 22-year-old Kurdish Iranian woman who was arrested for allegedly wearing her hijab too loose. Iranians are decrying her wrongful killing, and claim the government is trying to cover it up.

In response to the citizen's movement, the government of Iran has stepped up its violent crackdown. It has shut down internet access, as well as arrested, harmed, and killed more advocates, including many more young people.

Iranians across the globe, and their loved ones are demanding the return of basic rights in Iran. They ask for freedom - the freedom to dress how they wish and express themselves without fear of harm and consequences.
