Praxis Exam Update



The School Counselor Praxis Exam is required for graduation and licensure. There are currently two versions of the exam accepted by USBE: 5421 and 5422. Before September 1, 2023 students may register for and complete either exam. After September 1st, the 5422 version is required. Our program's Praxis Preparation Canvas course currently reflects the Praxis 5421 and ASCA 3rd edition content. Students presently participating in the prep course should be sure to review the ASCA 3rd vs. 4th Edition information, explaining key differences between exams. (Content is fairly similar and students will still benefit from working through the course regardless of which exam they choose to take.) Program Coordinator Meg Campbell will be updating the Praxis Prep course this summer to reflect the new Praxis 5422 material.
