

POLICY: Math Test

ADOPTION DATE: 2000 (updated September 2012)

All students are required to take and pass (at a criterion of 95%) the Special Education Math Test prior to admittance to the Special Education program. The test is consistent with the Utah State Core Curriculum and reflects some of the basic math skills and concepts needed to teach students with disabilities.

This test will be offered in the first five week block of every semester. Contact Co Brunner to make an appointment at (435) 797-3245 or cosette.brunner@usu.edu. Please plan approximately 1 hour to complete the test. The test is untimed and no calculators are allowed.

Students are allowed to take the SPED Math Test a maximum of two times for each application year. If student do not pass the first attempt, they must meet with their advisor to come up with a detailed study plan for remediation. If approved, the student may take the math test again in the following semester.

If students do not pass the math test on the second attempt, they must take a remedial math class at an Applied Technology College and wait out a year before attempting to take the math test again.
