Content Mentor Cooperating Teachers should NOT do the following:

- 1. Expect students to take full responsibility for the classroom.
- 2. Leave students alone in the classroom with elementary students for extended periods of time; you are there to support and mentor the student throughout the practicum.
- 3. Ask students to spend excessive time on clerical tasks, such as grading papers and photocopying.
- 4. Ask students to write curriculum units. The curriculum/lesson writing assignments they must complete for their methods classes are sufficient; however, when students have taught the lessons they are responsible for writing, they are NOT done teaching.
- 5. Ask students to go beyond contract hours.
