CONFERENCE DESCRIPTION: Utah State University Arts Are Core, a Beverley Taylor Sorenson Endowed Program for Elementary Arts Education presents their annual arts integration conference. The conference will be held online, August 4, 2021 from 8:30-2:30. Participants will experience hands-on arts integration workshops in visual art, dance, music, and drama, including teacher-created workshops and engaging presentations centered around the conference theme, Building Community. Participants will chat with presenters and fellow educators throughout the conference, walking away with enriched lesson plans connected to core curriculum, including downloadable resources to start the coming school year with creativity and energy! The conference is open to classroom teachers, arts educators, principals, school district administrators, teaching artists, partnering arts organizations, parents, and community members. COURSE DESCRIPTION: This course is designed to account for and reflect on professional development from attending conference sessions, workshops, and/or research lecturers. This course is targeted for K-12 educators and administrators, and all instruction occurs online.

REQUIREMENTS: To qualify for credit, Southern Utah University requires that learners must complete 15 hours of contact time per credit hour in any given course. Learners must register for Utah State University Arts Are Core Conference: Building Community which takes place on August 4, 2021. The conference is online. Noting the conference is six hours, all sessions will be available on-demand and provided to participants post conference. In this manner, students can attend additional sessions that were offered concurrently. Each conference session counts for 1 hour of contact time. By attending activities offered during the breaks and lunch period (which will also be available on-demand), this can account for the 15th hour of contact time.

EXPECTED LEARNING OUTCOMES: Students will actively participate in conference sessions and complete relevant assignments; engage with new ideas or methods; identify areas to develop professionally; construct a plan to use, apply, or adopt new ideas to improve teaching.

SCHEDULE AND LOCATION OF ASSIGNMENTS: See course calendar at bottom of syllabus. Enrollees will use Canvas to locate and submit assignments.

COURSE EXPECTATIONS: Students will complete a minimum of 15 hours of contact time at a conference; document participation, activities, and growth; and submit all assignments on time.

ASSIGNMENTS (500pts):

Documentation (100pts total) (20% of grade)

Enrollees must provide proof of conference registration (50pts) and attendance (50pts). Acceptable documentation includes receipt of paid registration AND a selfie at an in-person or virtual conference session.

List of Attended Sessions (10pts per contact hour, 150pts total) (30% of grade)

Enrollees must submit a list of attended sessions/conference activities with presenter name and session title, including the date each session/activity was attended. Enrollees must complete a minimum of 15 hours of contact time to receive 1 graduate credit. Please note, each session counts for 1 hour of contact time.

Writing Response (100pts total) (20% of grade)

Enrollees must write a double-spaced 300-word reflection on what they learned at the conference, focusing on at least 3 ideas from at least 3 attended sessions.

Final Action Plan (150pts total) (30% of grade)

As a final assignment, enrollees must submit a double-spaced 500-word plan describing how they will benefit from the conference. Plans should focus on improving teaching, lessons, and/or other professional areas. Enrollees must discuss at least 3 actions or improvements that they plan to pursue.
