

Secondary Teacher Education Course Structure

The three levels of the Secondary Teacher Education program for teacher licensure are offered during Spring and Fall Semesters only, in order to provide the required clinical experiences in the public schools. Each level must be completed before advancing to the next level. All courses must be completed with a minimum grade of C and a 3.00 GPA must be maintained overall and on STEP courses.

Courses listed as “Special Methods” and Clinical Experience” should be carefully planned with the help of the major, and where applicable, minor advisers. Although some students may need to complete three or more Methods Courses, only one clinical experience will be required during each semester.
